- Please follow the guidance of the Worship Hosts, going forward on one side of your section and returning to your seat on the other side.

BLESSING

Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, with all your strength.

Keep these words in your heart.

Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise.

Bind them as a sign on your hand, fix them as an emblem on your forehead, and write them on the doorpost of your house.

Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel, from everlasting to everlasting.

The peace of God, which surpasses all understanding,

guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

Amen.

You who dwell in the shelter of the Lord, who abide in this shadow for life, say to the Lord: "My refuge, my rock in whom I trust!"

Refrain

And he will raise you up on eagle's wings, bear you on the breath of dawn, make you to shine like the sun, and hold you in the palm of his hand.
