High school graduation is a time of great transition. It can be filled with hopes and dreams as well as anxieties and fears. This is a time when each graduate will be able to embrace greater autonomy; as they do we pray they know the continuing support of families, friends, mentors, and so many others. At Saint Andrew's Lutheran Church, this congregation has sought to mark milestones of faith from baptism, to first entering school, to receiving a Bible in third grade, and Affirmation of Baptism in ninth grade. With each milestone, we have remembered together God's promises of forgiveness, salvation and eternal life. These are steady promises as you venture forth into whatever your adventures might hold.

In Psalm 139 we hear these promises:
