Sunday Forum: Grateful Film Series: A Table of Gifts. Join the continuing conversation in this year long, six part film series with Diana Butler Bass discussing her book Grateful: The Transformational Power of Giving Thanks. In this session she continues by exploring Gifts. "So God is here, so what? How do we live?" Gratitude, according to Diana Butler Bass, is connected to living a grounded life with God. God With Us is always here and always giving. We live in a fear-instigated culture as scarcity conditioned people.
