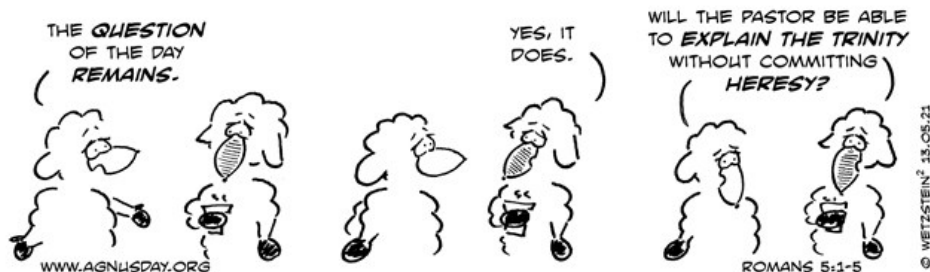

In 2016 a Task Force for Strategic Authentic Diversity was created by the ELCA Churchwide Assembly. We will discuss the definition of authentic diversity and how St. Andrew's is working towards meeting these goals set by the ELCA. This working document states, "We condemn any form of discrimination or harassment based on color, gender, race, ethnicity, social or socioeconomic status, sexual orientation, gender expression, or physical or intellectual (mental) ability. We propose a metanoia (a change of heart and mind) to dismantle structures of discrimination. We yearn to promote systemic and structural strategies to establish and ensure authentic diversity." We will unpack all of this information and with your thoughts, questions and ideas we will have a lively discussion.
